What is Lent you ask?

Early in the Church's history, the major events in Christ's life were noted with special observances, such as His birth, baptism, death, resurrection and ascension. As these observances developed, a period of time was set aside prior to the major events of Jesus' birth (Advent) and His death and resurrection (Lent) as a time of preparation. During Lent, our worship assumes a more penitential character. The color for the sea-son is purple, a color often associated with penitence. There have also been some changes to our worship pattern: we do not sing the "Hymn of Praise" (Gloria); the word "Alleluia" (a joyful expression meaning "Praise the Lord") is not used in the Gospel ac-clamation, and the Offertory that is sung as our offerings are presented at the altar has a somewhat somber tone. The Lenten season is clearly set apart as a distinct time from the rest of the year; it forms a powerful contrast with the festive celebration of Jesus' resurrection when our alleluias ring loud and clear.


